Shartia Brantley Selected As A "40 Under Forty"



Shartia Brantley, CNBC Segment Producer and Financial Contributor for the Grio.com, was selected by The Network Journal (TNJ) as one of its 2012 "40 Under Forty." The Network Journal is the New York tri-state magazine for Black professionals, corporate executives, and small business owners. Ms. Brantley was honored at the 15th Annual 40 Under Forty Achievement Awards Dinner on June 28, 2012 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in New York City's Times Square.

The milestone event, "Reaching for Higher Goals," was hosted by Karen Nethersole, Esq., CEO of Full Circle NY and Roman Oben, former New York Giants and 2003 Super Bowl XXXVII Champion (Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

TNJ's "40 Under Forty" began in 1997 to recognize the next generation of African-American leaders who, with a commitment to the development of their communities, are exceptional performers in their professions. The program, promoting mentorship and professional development, introduces these leaders to the established business community as role models for young African-Americans. The 40 achievers are profiled in the special June Issue of the magazine.

Ms. Brantley is a 1993 graduate of Dougherty Comprehensive High School in Albany, Georgia and a 1997 graduate of Albany State University. She received an MBA degree from Ohio State University, and she currently resides in Manhattan. Ms. Brantley, a member of Alpha Iota Chapter of Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, served as Luncheon Speaker for the 61st Annual Convention of Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society hosted by Gamma Lambda Chapter at Lincoln University and held in Jefferson City, Missouri.

Shartia Brantley never lost her childhood passion for a career in journalism while overcoming a speech impediment in elementary school and low self-esteem later as a teen. "Due to an acne problem, I lacked positive self-esteem to pursue broadcast journalism as an undergrad. At the time, I didn't realize it was all about makeup and good lighting!" She explains. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting at Albany State University and an MBA from Ohio State University's Fisher College of Business. Journalism beckoned, however. Soon after her 31st birthday, Brantley, the youngest of nine children, resigned from her job, put her house on the market and headed to New York to attend Columbia University School of Journalism. Today, she is a segment producer for CNBC's Street Signs, developing segments relating to the latest financial news and booking CEOs, elected officials and market strategists to appear on the show. She also reports for TheGrio.com, NBC's African-American news video site that uses original videos and articles. "I am very passionate about my work for TheGrio. "There's a misconception that African-Americans are not aware of or interested in what's happening in the stock market. My mission is to bring market and economic data to our community", she says.

With a grueling 12-hour day that starts at 4:15 a.m., Brantley exercises regularly to manage stress. "But my guilty pleasure is a day when I don't have to set the alarm at all," she confesses. She plans to become a motivational speaker to encourage others to pursue their life's passion. "I am not where I want to be yet, but I am so happy I decided to fulfill my purpose, my calling. There have been tons of sacrifices, but even more joy and fulfillment. I love what I do, and I've always wanted to be able to say that!"

Remember Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society In Your Will

Your attorney will be able to explain the tax advantage to you of making bequests to Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society. In terms of actual cost to your estate, the deductibility of such bequests for Federal estate tax purposes means that the actual dollar outlay may be far less than the face amount of the bequest. This is particularly true if you are a person of considerable means. Your attorney can acquaint you, in an approximate way, with the actual saving you may envision for your estate by means of such bequests. You need not make the bequests in outright form, but you may plan them so that they will take effect only upon the death of other members of your family for whom you will have made prior provisions in your will. In this way, you may accomplish the two-fold result of providing security for your closest loved ones while still seeing to it that, upon their deaths when the funds are no longer needed for their support, these funds will be put to constructive use.

Your bequests can take the form of furthering the general purpose of Alpha Kappa Mu or, if you so wish can be earmarked for some particular phase of Alpha Kappa Mu activities that specifically interests you. Although Alpha Kappa Mu will welcome and be grateful for such bequest for a specific purpose, Alpha Kappa Mu prefers that bequests not be restricted, so that after your death the money can be used for whatever programs are then most in need of funds.

If you are thinking of making a bequest to the Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, you should explore this matter fully with your attorney. He will be able to assist you in effectuating a plan which will best achieve our particular testamentary objectives. For the guidance of attorneys drafting wills which make bequests to Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, there are shown below a few samples

of the difference forms such bequest may take. Of course, these forms must be adapted by the attorney who makes use of them to the requirements of the particular instrument he is drafting. He must be aware of the interrelationships between such bequest and the other provisions of your will.

Unrestricted Bequest

I give and bequeath the sum of Dollars (\$_____) to Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society having its principal office at 324 Enterprise Drive, Albany, GA 31705, for its general purposes.

Restricted Bequest

I give and bequest the sum of Dollars (\$_____) to Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society having its principal office at 324 Enterprise Drive, Albany, GA 31705, for the purpose of (furthering Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society programs).

Bequest after Termination of Trust

Upon the death of my wife/husband, _____ I give devise and bequeath the principal of the trust for her/his benefit, as it shall then be constituted, to Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society having its principal office at 324 Enterprise Drive, Albany, GA, for its general purposes.


